March 13, 2020 was a sunny day. We had an In-Service day that day (it was a Friday). We had meetings on integrating Google Classroom into our teaching lexicon that day in lieu of an expected short disruption of classes caused by this new COVID-19 thing. We expected to be in school the following Monday and probably shutting down for a "few days" after that.

Later that day we were told that all of the schools in the state were shutting down for two weeks. The vast majority of the staff expected that we would be back by April 1 or at least shortly after Easter. But then we didn't...

The school sat dormant like a museum exhibit frozen in time, reminiscent of Pompeii after Vesuvius froze it in place. Coats and books remained in lockers, and on the table in front of the auditorium. The writings on the chalk board in 105 spoke of rehearsals and concerts that were passing by without us, as we stayed in stasis.

We didn't return, the music was left unperformed and the world remained silent as blowing into wind instruments was deemed a super spreading device spreading dangerous aerosols to our neighbors. The world stood motionless and silent, gripped by the fear of the spreading pandemic.

The question had to be asked. Would it *ever* be safe to make ensemble music again?

We battled through with buzzwords like face coverings and social distancing and "outside is better than inside". But it was a living breathing experiment based on what we learned in high school biology coupled with updates from the CDC. Somehow schools opened (more or less) in fall. We learned to learn and teach in new ways, ways in which we never expected or wanted to do these things. But we battled on.

We made modifications to school and modifications to sport, and we spread the band throughout the entire center section of Spartans Stadium and we continued to wage war against our oppressor. All standing at least 6 feet apart while being unable to share a hug, a high five or even a smile.

We fast forward to today. We have survived. We have made it this far. We have all been damaged by these events in some way, but we remain here... still standing.

We dedicate this concert to all of us. Heroes in our own way for surviving this attack on humanity and more aware than ever about how much we need each other.

The Notes

Flourish for Wind Band- The English composer, Ralph Vaughan Williams composed this work for a performance at the Royal Albert Hall in 1939. The score was misplaced shortly after the original performance and remained lost until 1971 when it was published and finally made available for American bands. It has since become a standard in band literature.

Proclamation and Symphonic Decree- Ed Huckeby composed this piece in 1996. It starts with a fanfare and then a celebration. We would like to think this our way of welcoming back something that seems close to normal.

Commando March-This is the only work for wind band by composer, Samuel Barber who is better known for his orchestral compositions. Barber wrote this piece in 1943 after joining the army. It is in tribute of the elite special forces of our military.

Rock Springs Saga- was composed by William Owens in 2007 after he visited Rock Springs, Wyoming. Inspired by the visit, the composer creates a score that could easily serve as the soundtrack to any classic cowboy movie or story about the old west.

With Quiet Courage-Larry Daehn composed this piece to honor his mother after her passing. He said that she "lived a life of quiet courage." During these difficult times we have all had to muster up the courage to face each day and do the little things for each other to keep ourselves and each other safe. These small acts of courage may not seem like much in the moment but add up to much more in the long run. This pieces celebrates the heroism in all of us.

American Faces — was commissioned for the Bands of America National Honor Band in 1995. This was supposed to open or close our concert in the spring of 2020. However, as stated earlier, those plans were put on hold. Finally, we get to perform it for you today with a slightly different cast than the students who originally performed it. Through the presentation of a variety of thematic ideas, David Holsinger presents us with the various "faces" that make up our great country. Sometimes these ideologies do battle and fight for space but the composer shows that when we come together and work for a common goal there is no greater or stronger country in the world. In the light of the last 15 months we dedicate this piece to you and all of us, because we are always stronger when we work together
